Brochure spelling & grammar competition and new web site part of fund raising for the new community hospital

Arriving with your TDC Newslines this week is the Friends of Motueka Hospital Trust's brochure on the proposed aged and dementia care service at the new Motueka hospital. This brochure has details of the present and future plans for services at the new hospital and how a donation can be made to the Trust.

The Trust is looking for over 200 families to contribute \$10,000 each for this community owned facility. "Your family name will be listed in the honours board and you will also be known as a 'Friend' of the Trust," stated Jack Inglis Chairman of the Trust. "We are also a registered tax charity for IRD purposes and can take your promissory to cover payments over a number of years. A contribution of \$100,000 either directly or via your estate will give naming rights to a room," said Jack Inglis.

The brochure is part of a competition to **WIN** one of **3** prizes of **\$100**. "We purposely included a number of spelling and grammar errors in the brochure" stated Colin Truman, Trust Executive Officer "Identify them and send your answers back to us to be in to win \$100." Also this week the Trust's web site comes on-line. The web address is www.fomht.org.nz. The web site has been developed by local website developers Gary & Ann Webber of WeDoWebsites who kindly donated part of the cost of the development to the Trust.

The web site contains information about the Trust. The web site has all the contact details, a brief history and plans for the services at the new hospital. "We tried to make the web site as user-friendly as possible. A donation form is available for down loading. There is also an example of a codicil which can be used to make changes to your existing will. And details of fund raising events will be published on the web site," said Colin Truman.

Subject to the successful raising of funds the new service is expected to open within 18 months and will be located to the west of the existing Motueka Community Hospital. The workforce at the hospital is expected to grow to approximately 55 staff.
